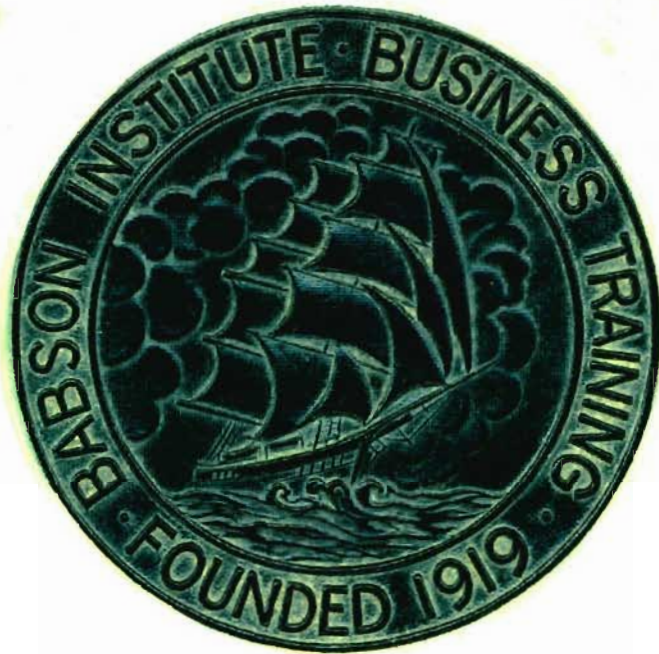

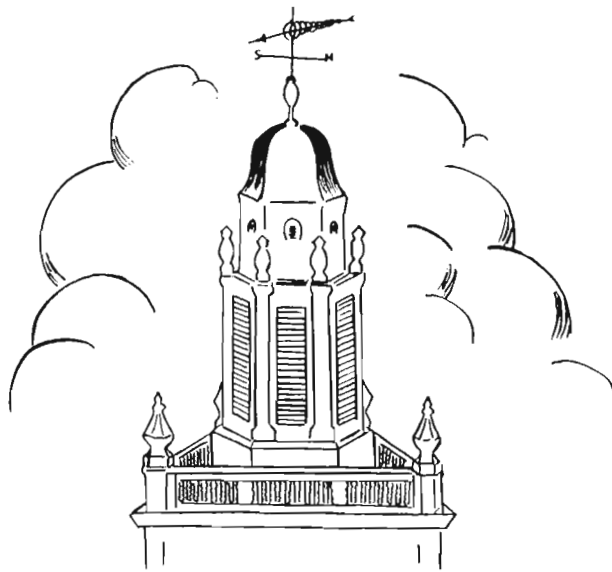

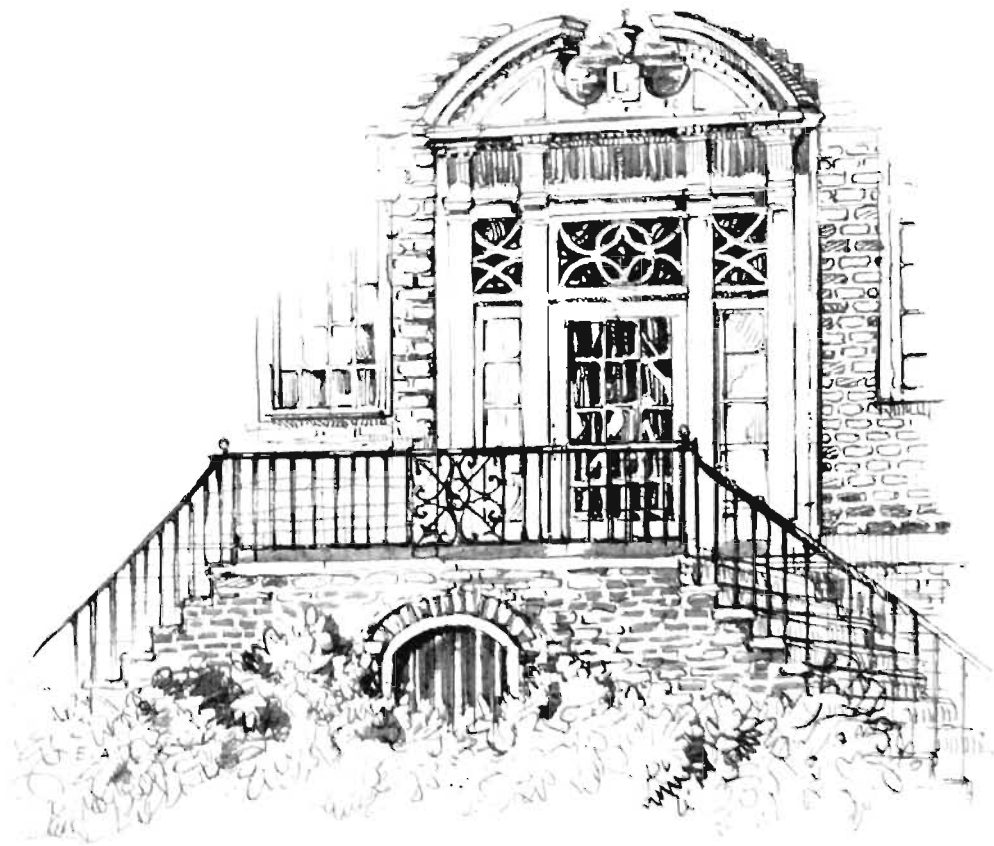

THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Francois Villon once wrote a very moving poem of which the refrain line was, "Where are the snows of yesteryear?". As I dictate this message to the Class of 1949 and other friends of the Institute on March 18, 1949, the ground is white with snow and a thoroughgoing New England blizzard is still raging outside my window. Can you, from the vantage point of warm, sunny, June weather look back upon the snows of last winter? If you can, let me urge you to look back even further through the past thirty years of Our Mutual Enterprise.

When Babson Institute was founded in July of 1919, the first class of 25 men met in a private dwelling house at 31 Abbott Road for instruction. From such a humble beginning Babson Institute has developed into one of the outstanding colleges of Business Administration in this country with a beautiful rolling campus of 340 acres, 16 up-to-date buildings, a student body of over 500, a substantial endowment, and a future as bright as the proverbial pot of gold at the end of the rainbow. What has contributed to make this tremendous change in our resources in the course of 30 years?

The first and most natural answer to my question will be, of course, Mr. and Mrs. Roger W. Babson. Their unswerving faith in the ideals of the institution, their devoted attention to its development and growth, their most generous and repeated contributions to its financial stability through land, buildings, and endowment, have been and will remain indispensable to the present development and future reputation of the Institute.

In the second place, the patient, careful hours of teaching contributed by the many members of the faculty over the past thirty years together built a reputation for successful business training which has given Babson Institute its present enrollment and high position in the field of business education.

Thirdly, the intellectual and extracurricular efforts of the student body during the thirty years of the Institute's growth, first as undergraduates and later as graduates of our program, have made fundamental and essential contributions to the intangible assets of the Institute by their success, first on the campus and then in the field of business. Our reputation today

In the fourth place, the wise, forward looking counsel of the Trustees and the Incorporators in safeguarding and directing the resources of the Institute should not be forgotten. Therefore, it is with real feelings of humility and responsibility in carrying on Our Mutual Enterprise that I salute in this, the thirtieth year *Babsonian*, all those individuals and groups who have together given of their funds, their minds, and their hearts to create an ever better Babson Institute.

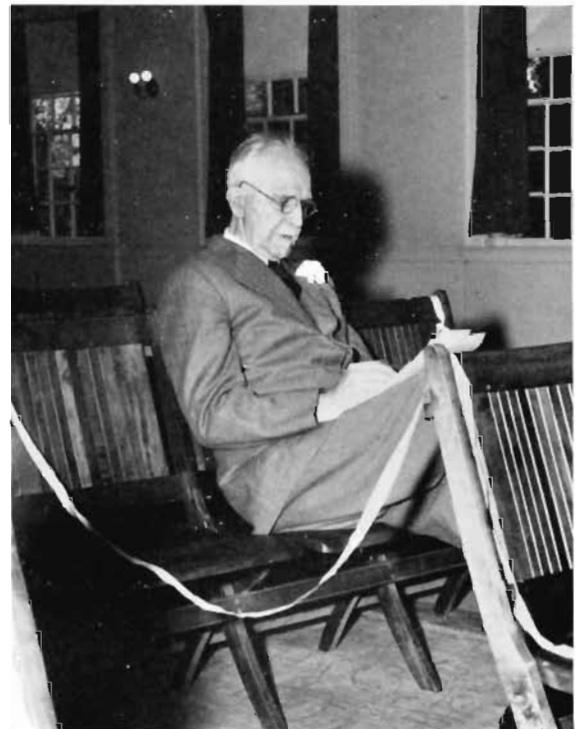
FOUNDERS' DAY

The second annual celebration of Founders' Day was held November 12, 1948, at Knight Auditorium. Conceived by the students for the purpose of honoring Mr. and Mrs. Babson, the assembly this year reviewed the business interests of the founders, thereby indicating the background and experience implementing Babson Institute. The presentation of a bronze plaque commending the job done by the Institute during the war in the training of Naval Supply Officers was made by Captain David P. Polatty, U. S. N. Gifts expressing the regard and affection of the students, faculty, administration, and alumni were presented to Mr. and Mrs. Babson.

The program was recorded and made a part of the permanent archives of Babson Institute.





THE BABSON HOUR

As a vital part of an integrated program, the Babson Hour provides the nucleus for spiritual activities on the campus. Student participation in various denominational groups of the community is well-established, but it is around this Sunday-evening service that the religious life of the school is centered.

Last fall marked the appearance of a new chaplain, the Rev. Dr. Bernard C. Graves. Under Dr. Graves, the Babson Hour has taken the form of a "Fireside Fellowship." Beginning with the winter term, the meetings were conducted around the theme, "A Story of Our Faith," a study of the growth of the different forms of our churches. This informal type of meeting has encouraged the participation of the students in the discussions. Both our founder, Mr.

Babson, and our president, Dr. Hinckley, are actively interested in these weekly services and from time to time address the group.

Working in conjunction with Dr. Graves is the Chapel Committee of the Student Council, composed of David Moseley, Sidney Adair, Robert Bartlett, Dayton Brown, and James Saks. Through this group the students assume an active role in the direction of the services which represent their quest for spiritual growth. An intelligent and forceful faith, not only academic and business tools, is essential to the complete man. On awareness of this, the non-sectarian religious program of the Institute is founded; to the fulfillment it is dedicated.

STUDENT COUNCIL

Celebrating an important anniversary can prove of keen interest to all groups that have been connected with the Institute in a span of 30 years. What may well be of closer interest to the present Babson student is the emergence of a Student Council (much too young to even presume to count birthdays) into a governing body possessing considerable responsibilities. That the assumption of such obligations is not an automatic process and that it is accompanied with tribulations as well as triumphs will be readily admitted by most Council members. For it cannot be denied that this group has extended its activities and is steadily wielding more and more power on campus. That it has by no means reached its peak efficiency is also acknowledged. However, it is to the credit of this year's Council, under the adroit leadership of Proctor Coffin, that a great step forward has been accomplished, a step leading inevitably to the realization of its full potentiality.

In review, the results appear much more striking than they possibly could have in the week-to-week endeavors. It has been well-demonstrated that the student body is vitally interested in the organization representing them and will militantly support them whenever they believe a principle to be at stake.

Representing the student body in a different capacity is the Cabinet. Composed of the heads of the various organizations, it works in an advisory function in conjunction with the Director of Student Activities. Unlike the Council, it is not a formal organization. Rather, it brings to the attention of the Administration student recommendations for the improvement of our extra-curricular program. A smaller group, operating mainly in the informal, congenial atmosphere of dinner meetings, the Cabinet held many a provocative discussion, and it is to be hoped that a still greater cooperation between it and the Student Council may develop, thus carrying the entire phase of student government much faster along the road to complete success.

The third important student governing body is the Athletic Council. One has only to look at the vastly expanded athletic program for proof of this group's efficacy. The program of these sports' leaders has never shown signs of faltering, and the results have been progressively more gratifying. That the chairmanship of Ed Piragas had much to do with this cannot be challenged.

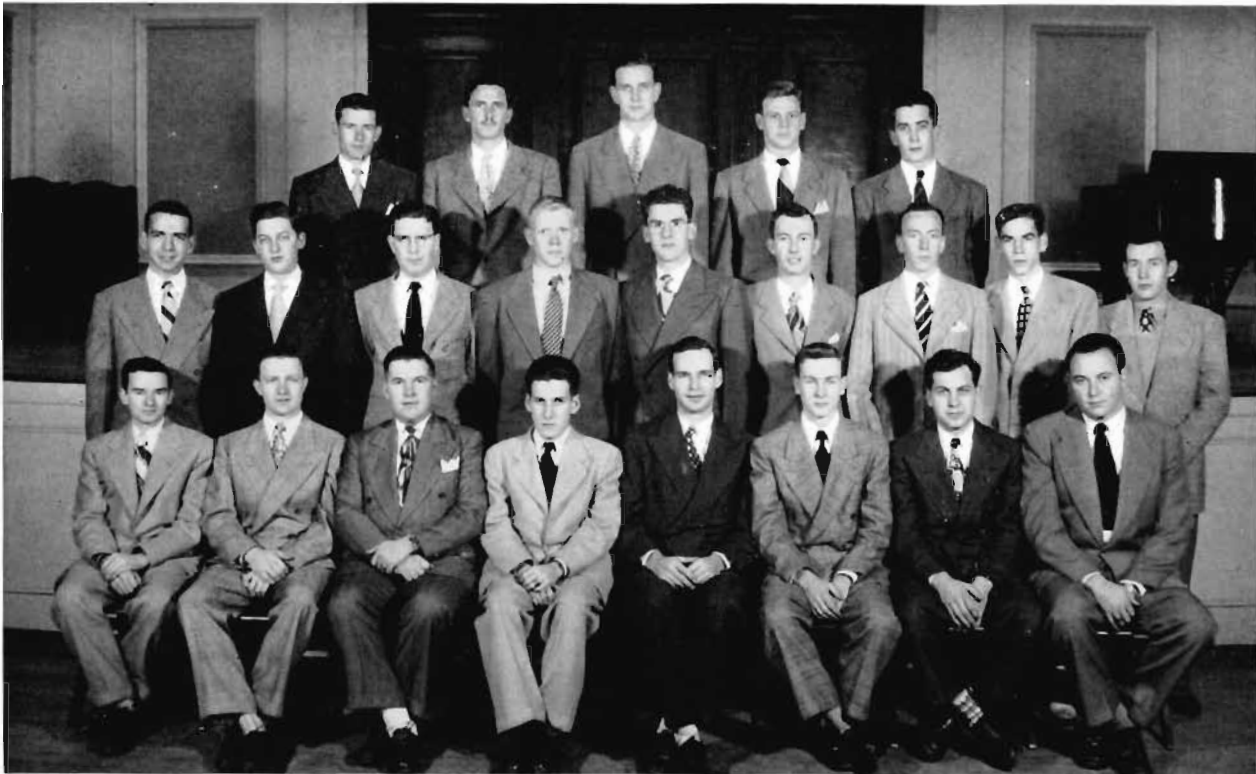

are now solved, and the club can number itself among the few groups on campus boasting of national affiliation.

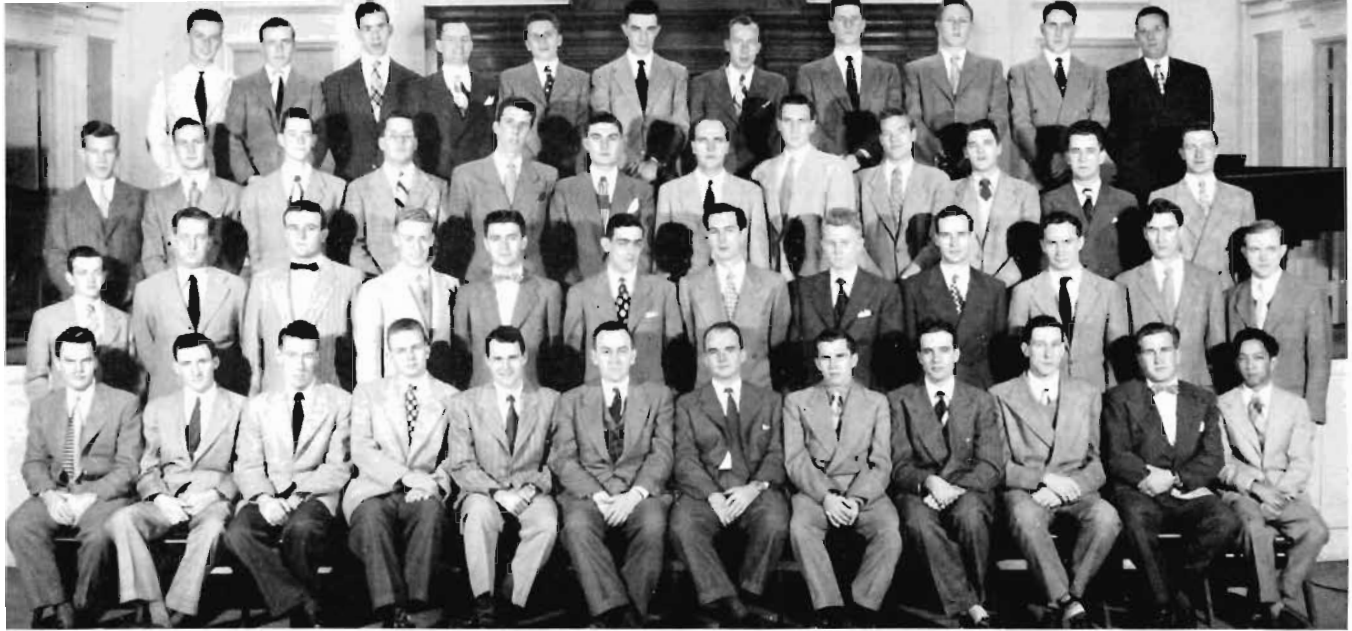

As a member of the Association of Northeastern Flying Clubs, the group hopes to be a challenger for the Intercollegiate Trophy. Entrants in the meet are required to

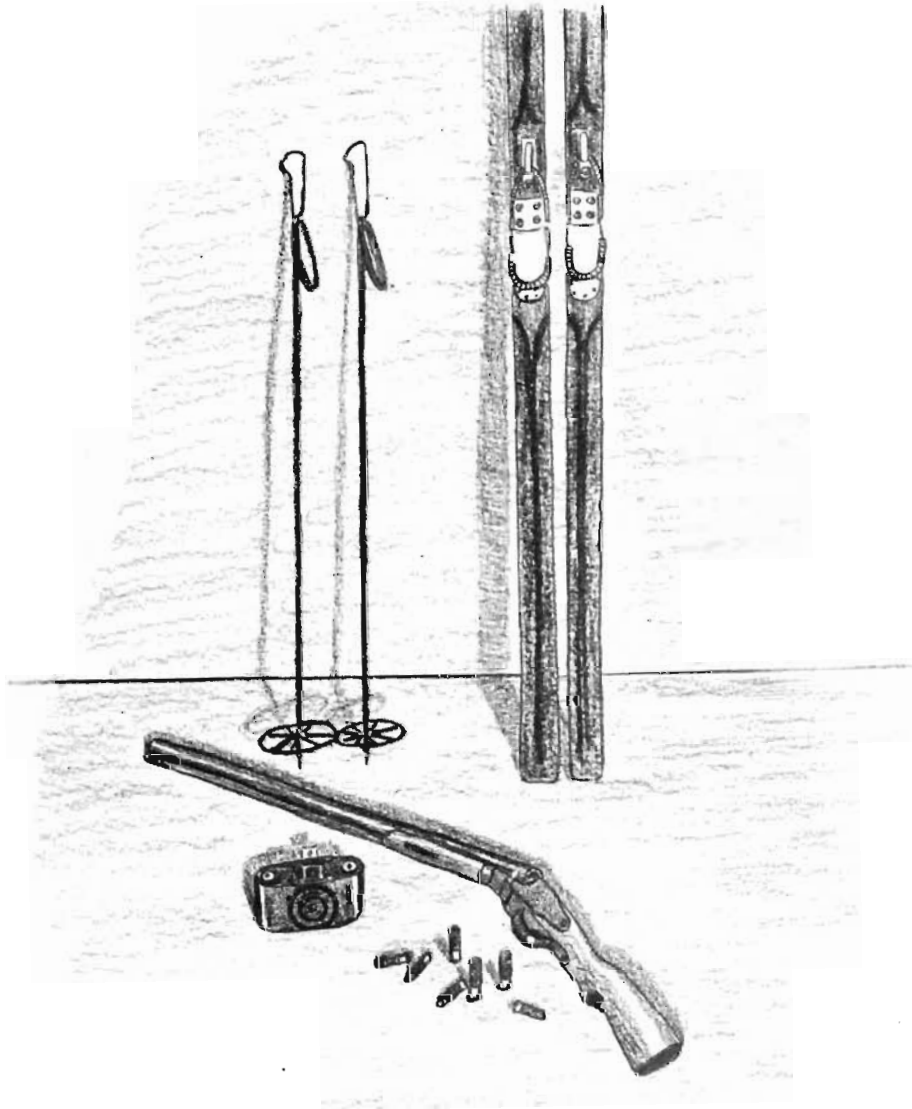
compete in the following events: precision flying, spot landing, ribbon-cutting, and simulated bombing.

SKEET shooting was Babson's first bid for intercollegiate recognition. Started only two years ago, the sport has grown, from competition with local shooting clubs, to a place of prominence in the national intercollegiate field. As founders of intercollegiate skeet shooting in New England, the Babson group has been instrumental in organizing the sport among the Eastern colleges. The 1948 season ended with Babson

Institute being led only by West Point in a field of distinguished rivals at the Intercollegiate Championship Match at the Lordship Gun Club in Stratford, Conn. The final standings for 1948 were as follows: Army, Babson, Yale, and Harvard. The 1949 schedule promises to be many times larger and should find the home team right up there contending for first place.

To maintain their ever-growing schedule and still operate within their budget, the skeet shooters have adopted the use of telegraphic competition with their distant rivals, such as the Universities of Texas and California. This eliminates the travel problem and also gives each team the advantage of its home field.

GOLF is another sport in which Babson has proved very proficient. Last year, in the team's first attempt at intercollegiate competition, the record could hardly have been more gratifying. While playing ten matches, the team lost only one, winning over such rivals as Holy Cross, Tufts, R. P. I., Manhattan, and Hofstra.

This year the schedule is still more imposing, and expectations are for as admirable a record as before. Additions to the schedule include Dartmouth, Harvard, and Boston College—a schedule, incidentally, which is as fine as any college can boast. Not one of the matches can be considered a breather. The hope is that by summer the Babson golfers, under the captaincy of Dick Gifford, will have a well-established reputation among Eastern colleges.

BASKETBALL came into its own this year as an intercollegiate sport. Although the records show that this game

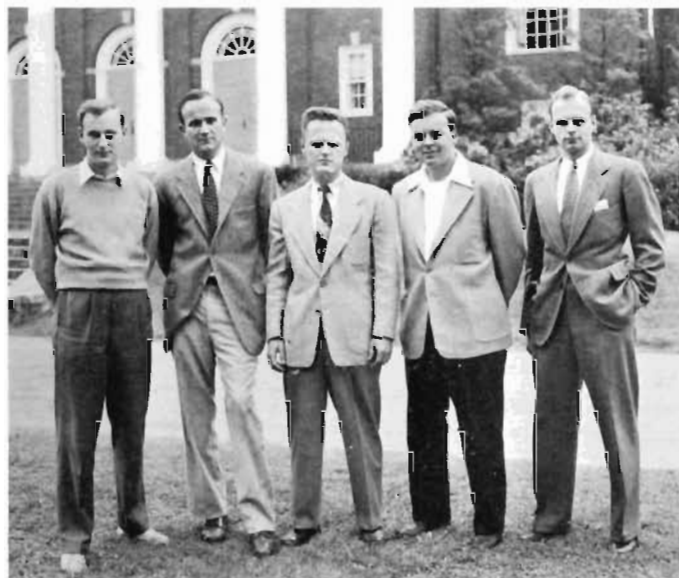
